First Reading Isaiah 50:5-9

The Lord has opened my ear.

For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away.

I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle.

The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me?

Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me.

The Lord is coming to my help, who dare condemn me?

The Psalm

I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, "I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty", without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: "You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds - now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show."

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'

They need your assistance now more than ever as people suffer terrible hardship as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. There are families short of food, lonely people who need a friend, homeless individuals and families, people struggling with financial hardship, or those facing illness. Please help in whatever way you can – whether it's picking up some shopping for a neighbour, phoning someone for a chat, or giving someone a lift to the doctor. SVP: Food Bank

For some years now members of our parish SVP conference have been working with King's Church to operate a Food bank each Friday morning at St Columba's on Clifton Road in Darlington. Together with other volunteers, we collect the food parcels from the hub at King's Church, set up at St Columba's then between 11am and 12 noon, distribute the bags of groceries to our clients.

If donations of fresh food from our local supermarkets are low, St Augustine's SVP funds and organises supplementing this, purchasing fruit and vegetables to give out. The food parcels typically comprise tins and packets of basic foodstuffs, such as pasta, rice, tinned meat and vegetables, plus a few goodies along with a bag of bread and fresh produce. Where possible we also offer toiletries and dog/cat food.

As well as collecting, organising and distributing the food parcels, there is administrative work to do as all clients must register and provide evidence of their need for emergency food. This is reviewed every six to ten weeks. Over the years we have got to know clients who require long-term support and have tried to provide a sympathetic ear as well as the practical help. With others we have shared the joy of a change in circumstances so that they no longer need our help. Yet others come from time to time, when they are at a low point financially for a variety of reasons and it is a privilege for us to be able to give a helping hand. Numbers vary from week to week, probably averaging 14-18 though at times we have had over 20 clients.

At times our SVP has identified some additional needs of clients, for example setting up in accommodation, struggles to afford nappies for a baby, a desk for a family member to be able to study, and we have been able to step in to ease the burden.

Throughout the pandemic, a small core group of SVP members continued to run the St Columba's Food Bank with Covid measures in place. None of this would be possible without the generous support of parishioners, some of whom donate items for distribution and others who make a financial contribution to our parish conference, This enables us to continue to help and support some of the most vulnerable and needy members of our local community, in keeping with our Vincentian mission "so that our hearts beat with the heartbeat of the poor and we come to see poverty through their eyes".

PARISH CENTRE

Unfortunately due to Diocesan guidelines we are unable to allow the hall be used for parish events. The Centre will only be available for the use of regulated groups who have PL insurance, have completed a full risk assessment and have a designated leader who will ensure that they follow the guidelines outlined by the Diocese.
