#### DIOCESAN LISTENING EXERCISE

On Tuesday the diocese published Bishop Stephen's Reflection on the Listening Exercises and The Results of the Questionnaire for the Diocestery Report. The bulk of the publication, which is available on the Diocesan website, is a series of appendices which are summary reports of the listening exercise as experienced respectively by the deacons, priests, diocesan employees, religious and laity and a final appendix which is a summary of the responses to the questionnaire conducted for the Dicastery of Bishops. It is all worth reading, not least because the point of this exercise must surely be that we listen carefully to one another. The headline item, however, is the bishop's response to the whole process- if nothing else please read this. This publication does not mean that the listening process is at an end but that, having reached this stage, we consider carefully what has been shared and, as Bishop Stephen says, start "thinking together about the kind of Church we are called to be in 2024".

# ST AUGUSTINE'S TO HOST PRIESTS' STUDY DAY 5th MARCH

There will be two days of recollection/study days for the priests on the new ESV Lectionary which will be introduced in England and Wales on the first Sunday of Advent this year. ### First Reading: Exodus 20:1-3.7-8.12-17

God spoke all these words. He said, I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no gods except me.

You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.

Honour your father and your mother so that you may have a long life in the land that the Lord your God has given to you.

You shall not kill.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.

You shall not covet your neighbours house.

You shall not covet your neighbours wife, or his servant, man or woman, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is his.

## Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:22-25

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

### Gospel: John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.
